Students Centred Methods of Teaching

Before the commencement of the semester, a presentation has to be made by each faculty for each subject to the principal and outlining the proposed approach for delivery of the course. Review of academic performance by the head of the Institution by every week. The faculty members will employ learner centric techniques such as web related assignments, peer teaching, discussion methods, experiential learning, use of audio-visual aids, projects, etc in the delivery of academic programmes.

Each member of the teaching faculty is allocated with the task of mentoring 10 to 15 students. They are responsible for academic and personal mentoring.

This is to strengthen the bonds of appreciation and affection that exists between teachers and students. Tutors keep the progress of the students in the Teacher's diary. This method ensures one to one interactions with the students.

Teachers training programmes organised periodically to train the staff in ICT based teaching. The students encouraged to prepare slides and power point presentations as part of their assignments and project presentations. This makes the teaching – learning process a two-way process, involving both the teachers and learners.

The University examination (theory and practical) of 3 hours duration shall ordinarily be conducted between October and December during the odd semesters and also between April and June during the even semester. Each course, both theory and practical (including project work & viva voce Examinations) shall be evaluated for a maximum of 100 marks.

For all theory and practical courses including project work, the continuous• internal assessment are carry out for 20 marks while the End-Semester University examinations marks for 100 marks has been converted 80 marks. The University examination for project work shall consist of evaluation of the final report submitted by the student or students of the project group (of not exceeding 4 students) by an external examiner and an internal examiner, followed by a viva-voce examination conducted separately for each student by a committee consisting of the external examiner, the supervisor of the project group and an internal examiner.

Evaluation:

A candidate can apply for revaluation / photocopy of his/her semester examination answer paper in a theory course, within 2 weeks from the declaration of results, on payment of a prescribed fee through proper application to the Controller of Examination. A candidate can apply for revaluation of answer scripts for not exceeding 5 subjects at a time.

Candidates not satisfied with revaluation can apply for review of his/her examination answer paper in a theory course within the prescribed date on payment of a prescribed fee through proper application to Controller of Examination. Candidates applying for Photocopy-cum-Revaluation only are eligible to apply for review.


